

**DAY01****Arrive Kathmandu**

Meeting at the airport upon arrival by office personnel. Kathmandu is the capital of Nepal and the Kathmandu Valley is the political and cultural heart of the Kingdom. After arrival you will be transferred to the hotel.

**Day 2****Kathmandu**

This morning, you will be taken for a visit to experience the Hindu culture in Nepal at Pashupatinath. This is the place where holy sadhus pray. The Pashupatinath Temple, a sacred Hindu temple dedicated to Lord Pashupatinath, is located on the banks of the Bagmati River, about 5 km north-east of Kathmandu Valley. It is one of the most sacred temples of the Hindu faith and serves as the seat of Nepal's national deity. The temple complex, a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1979, is an extensive Hindu temple precinct with temples, ashrams, images, and inscriptions raised over centuries along the riverbanks.

We then continue to the holiest shrine for the Buddhist culture in Nepal, Bouddhanath, with its large stupa where Buddhist devotees come for pilgrimage. Later, you will visit Patan (also known as Lalitpur, the "City of Beauty"), which lies just across the Bagmati River from Kathmandu and is the second-largest town in the valley. Patan is known for its rich architectural heritage and ancient masterpieces. Its central Durbar Square is filled with temples, boasting a greater concentration of temples per square meter than either Kathmandu or Bhaktapur. Within the city also lies the Tibetan Refugee Center, home to much of the valley's Tibetan population. While technically refugees, Tibetans here are among the wealthiest in the valley due to their thriving carpet industry. This is the perfect place to shop for authentic Tibetan carpets.

You will then proceed to Swayambhunath, the golden spire of the 5th-century stupa adorned with colorful prayer flags. Crowning a hill overlooking the Kathmandu Valley, it offers spectacular views of the city. Swayambhunath is one of Nepal's most recognizable symbols, with the painted eyes of Buddha watching over all who ascend its ancient stone steps.

Day 3

Kathmandu – Chandragiri Hills

(by Cable Car)

This morning, you will be taken to Chandragiri Hills, located approximately 17 km from the city center, on the south-west of the Kathmandu Valley, at an altitude of 2,551 meters above sea level. The soaring peaks and breathtaking views of the entire Kathmandu Valley, covered with a lush green blanket of flora, make Chandragiri a truly pristine and bountiful landscape. The panoramic views of the valley and the Himalayan ranges, stretching from Annapurna to Everest, make it feel like you are seeing all of Nepal from this hill.

Drive from your hotel to Thankot and then take a cable car up to Chandragiri Hills. The Chandragiri Cable Car is a gondola lift



Day 4

Age Group (0-3yrs): Valid Original Birth certificate on which DOB mentioned with parents' name 2. Age Group (below 18yrs) : travelling with parent (or) guardian, will be allowed with School Id Card (original) or Letter Head from School with Photo and Principal's Stamp and Signature or a valid passport (with the expiry date of six months

at least from the date of return) if travelling alone 3. Age Group (18 and above) : Only valid Voter ID or Passport is valid to travel to Nepal 4. The Emergency Certificate and Identity Certificate issued by the Embassy of India, Kathmandu will be valid for single journey for travelling back to India. Also Note:- 1. Aadhaar (UID) card / PAN card / Driving License are not an acceptable travel document for travel to Nepal. 2. Certificate of Registration issued by the Embassy of India, Kathmandu, Nepal to Indian nationals is not an acceptable travel document for travelling between India and Nepal. General Information: All travelers while returning to India should submit a self-declaration form (mandatory) on the online Air Suvidha portal (www.newdelhiaairport.in) before the scheduled travel, including the last 14 days of travel details. Each passenger shall also submit a declaration with respect to the authenticity of the report and will be liable for criminal prosecution if found otherwise. The id should clearly reflect the traveller's picture, school or college name, date of birth as well as the class in which the student is studying.
